

As the European Commission paves the way for open access, a consistent policy environment is needed across the EU.

The European Commission has extended and solidified its open access policy for the upcoming Horizon 2020 research funding programme. **Alma Swan** welcomes the clear signal from Brussels which has issued a Recommendation for Member States to follow its lead. But the policy picture across the Union is patchy and there is a need for a simple, consistent set of requirements to create a harmonised research environment across the EU.

The Finch Report – (actually called “Accessibility, sustainability, excellence: research publications” — [executive summary \(PDF\)](#)) set out to recommend a strategy to “expand access to the published findings of research”. It recognises that its conclusions are a compromise

- a clear policy direction should be set towards support for publication in open access or hybrid journals, funded by APCs, as the main vehicle for the publication of research, especially when it is publicly funded;

How did the UK government manage to spoil something as good as open access?



There are still serious flaws to the UK government's policy on open access, argues **Frederick Friend**, particularly in how it has prioritised a system with article processing charges (APCs) as the main vehicle for the publication of research. The recent Parliamentary BIS Committee report has recognised these flaws but it is unclear whether balanced change to the policy is afoot. Universities should continue to insist on a system that operates without artificial restrictions imposed by publishers.

Open access to publicly-funded research journal articles has been growing steadily across the world over the past ten years, and the value of unrestricted use and re-use of research results to current and

Open Access is:

- ▶ an inevitable consequence of the internet
- ▶ a good investment and a fair deal for the taxpayer
- ▶ confusing
- ▶ a challenge for publishers, learned societies, funders, academics and librarians

Open Access is not:

- ▶ free (or the same as 'file-sharing')
- ▶ the end of peer review
- ▶ synonymous with low quality
- ▶ only for wealthy life scientists

Důsledky (pro knihovny?)

- změny ve způsobu zpřístupňování informací
- změna finančních toků
